Statistics update

INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS

Vanuatu National Statistics Office (VNSO) from 2020 is giving its International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) an improved form and more information with an intent to satisfy user demands. The new and improved IMTS includes trade classified using the internationally recommended:

- Harmonised System (HS);
- Standard International Trade Classification (SITC); and
- Broad Economic Category (BEC).

It contains data on imports, exports and re-exports by:

- Principal imports, exports and re-exports;
- Major trading partners; and
- Major regions Vanuatu trades with.

A table has been included on the mode of transport used for trading.

A valuable addition to the list of IMTS tables is the retained imports that have been used to calculate the:

- Consumption goods;
- Intermediate goods; and
- Investment goods.

The new set of tables will allow better comparison of Vanuatu IMTS regionally and internationally.

<u>JANUARY 2021 – PROVISIONAL HIGHLI</u>GHTS

January 2021 compared to January 2020

Merchandise Export

The total value of merchandise exports decreased by 37 percent or (VT 157 million) from VT 429 million to VT 272 million in January 2021. Domestic export earnings (excluding re-exports) for January 2021 stood at VT 260 million, decreased by 12 percent or VT 36 million over January 2020. (*Refer to Table 1&3*). This decrease was due to reductions in two main export categories:

- (HS Section IV 16-24) prepared foodstuffs, beverages, spirits & tobacco
- ♦ (HS Section I 01-05) live animals: animal products

Merchandise Import

The total value of merchandise imports decreased by 24 per cent or (VT 732 million) to VT 2,363 million in January 2021 compared to VT 3,095 million in January 2020. (*Refer to Table 1&2*). This monthly decrease was due to reductions in three main import categories:

- ♦ (HS Section XVI 84-85) vehicles aircraft & associated transport equipment
- ♦ (HS Section XVII 86-89) machinery & mechanical & electrical appliances & parts thereof and base metals & articles thereof

Trade Balance

The total value of merchandise import stood at (VT 2,363 million) exceeded that of export by VT 272 million resulting in a deficit balance at (VT 2,092 million) in January 2021.




Figure 1: Terms of trade -All items

EXPORT

Main commodities: The main export commodity group that recorded decreases in January 2021 were: re-exported goods and other products representing respectively 91 and 86 percent of exported goods. However, kava exports recorded a significant increase at 55 percent, representing 67 percent share to total exports. The bulk of kava were exported to Kiribati, USA and Fiji. Other products comprised mainly of other frozen fish and scrap metal, while fuels, alcoholic drinks, tobacco and cigarettes made up the total to re-export in January 2021. (*Refer to Table 6*)

Main export market destination in January 2021, led by Fiji accounted for 16 percent share of total merchandise exports value, followed by New Caledonia, China and Australia, at 12, 11 and 9 percent shares respectively of total exports. According to changes in value between countries, New Zealand and China recorded falls in export value 94 and 67 percent respectively during the month, reflecting reductions in kava, coffee, food supplements, sandalwood logs and noni juice over the same period of the previous year. (*Refer to Table 8*). The Asia region recorded a significant decrease by 63 percent or (VT 626 million) to the export value compared to January 2020. ((*Refer to Table 9*).

Mode of transport in January 2021, "Sea" recorded largest share of total exports accounted for 77 percent and 19 percent recorded for "Air" respectively. (*Refer to Table 10*).

IMPORT

Main commodities which reflected decreases in January 2021 were: motor vehicles for transport of goods and passengers, almost 90 per cent or (VT 86 million), followed by Telephone sets, including telephones for cellular networks or for other wireless networks and Articles of iron or steel at 52 and 44 percent respectively compared to January 2020. (*Refer to Table 7*).

Major source markets registered top four countries: Singapore (22) percent, Australia (20) percent, Fiji (16) percent and New Caledonia (12) percent, consequently accounting for 70 percent share to total imports value in January 2021. (*Refer to Table 8*). The main origin of imports by region recorded Asia leading shares at 57 percent followed by Oceania 38 percent to total imports in January 2021. (*Refer to Table 9*).

Mode of Transport shares to total imports registered 79 per cent by "Sea" and 9 per cent by "Air" in January 2021. (*Refer to Table 10*)

End use categories of retained imports (BEC) comprised of consumption goods at 33 percent or (VT 786 million), intermediated goods at 30 percent or (VT 703 million) and capital goods at 17 percent or (VT 392 million) to total retained imports in January 2021. (*Refer to Table 14*)

Balance of trade	Balance of trade of goods is the net sum of exports and imports of goods.
	 Surplus denotes a positive trade balance which indicates that the value of exports has exceeded the value of imports. Deficit denotes negative trade balance which indicates that the value of imports has exceeded the value of exports.
BEC	Broad Economic Category: a classification that groups commodities according to its end use.
CIF	Cost, insurance and freight : includes the transaction value of the goods, insurance and freight to deliver the goods from the border of the exporting country to the border of the importing country.
FOB	Free on board : includes the transaction value of the goods and the value of services performed to deliver goods to the border of the exporting country.
HS	Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System: is a classification of exports and imports of goods. The latest version is '2017' and the custodian of it is the World Customs Organisation (WCO). Vanuatu uses the Vanuatu Harmonized System based off the WCOs HS17. Vanuatu HS is closely aligned to the Pacific HS2017. For HS Sections and Chapters refer to Appendix 3.
IMTS	International merchandise trade statistics : records all goods, which add to or subtract from the stock of material resources of a country by entering (imports) or leaving (exports) its economic territory.
