Statistics update

INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS

Vanuatu National Statistics Office (VNSO) from 2020 is giving its International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) an improved form and more information with an intent to satisfy user demands. The new and improved IMTS includes trade classified using the internationally recommended:

- Harmonised System (HS);
- Standard International Trade Classification (SITC); and
- Broad Economic Category (BEC).

It contains data on imports, exports and re-exports by:

- Principal imports, exports and re-exports;
- Major trading partners; and
- Major regions Vanuatu trades with.

A table has been included on the mode of transport used for trading.

A valuable addition to the list of IMTS tables is the retained imports that have been used to calculate the:

- Consumption goods;
- Intermediate goods; and
- Investment goods.

The new set of tables will allow better comparison of Vanuatu IMTS regionally and internationally.

FEBRUARY 2021 – PROVISIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

February 2021 compared to February 2020

Merchandise Export

The total value of merchandise exports decreased by 73 percent or (VT 340 million) from VT 464 million to VT 124 million in February 2021. Domestic export earnings (excluding re-exports) for February 2021 stood at VT 108 million, decreased by 67 percent or VT 223 million over February 2020. (*Refer to Table 1&3*). This decrease was due to reductions in two main export categories:

- ♦ (HS Section IV: 16-24) prepared foodstuffs, beverages, spirits & tobacco, vegetable products
- ♦ (HS Section II: 06-14) animal or vegetable oils & fats

Merchandise Import

The total value of merchandise imports decreased slightly by 9 percent or (VT 281 million) to VT 2,893 million in February 2021 compared to VT 3,174 million in February 2020. (*Refer to Table 1&2*). This monthly decrease was due to reductions in two main import categories:

- ♦ (HS Section V: 25-27) mineral products
- ♦ (HS Section VI: 28-38) chemicals and allied products

Trade Balance

The total value of merchandise import is (VT 2,893 million) exceeded that of export by VT 124 million resulting in a deficit of (VT 2,769 million) in February 2021 (*Table 1*)




Figure 1: Terms of trade February 2021 and February 2020 (Million Vatu)

EXPORT

By main commodities: There were no shipments on three main export commodity group; beef, cocoa and copra that is reflected in the total exports in February 2021, a further decline in coconut oil, coffee and kava representing respectively 96, 86 and 79 percent of exported goods compared to February 2020. However, kava exports stood at VT 42 million, representing 34 percent share to total exports in February 2021. The bulk of kava were exported to New Caledonia and the United States of America. Other products comprised mainly of other frozen fish and scrap metal, while fuels, alcoholic drinks, tobacco and cigarettes made up the total to re-export in February 2021. (*Refer to Table 6*)

Main export market destination in February 2021, China leading by 36 percent share of total merchandise exports value, followed by New Caledonia and Australia representing 23 and 15 percent shares respectively. According to changes in value between countries, China and New Caledonia recorded increases to the export value by VT 43 million and VT 1 million respectively during the month, reflecting increases in wood, kava and tuna fish over the same period of the previous year. *Refer to Table* 8). The Oceania region recorded a significant decrease by 82 percent or (VT 277 million) to the export value compared to February 2020. ((*Refer to Table 9*).

Mode of transport in February 2021, "Sea" recorded largest share of total exports accounted for 71 percent and 16 percent recorded for "Air" respectively, also reflecting declines by 61 and 81 per cent over February 2020. (*Refer to Table 10*).

IMPORT

By main commodities: which recorded decreases were: Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals 68 percent, Portland cement, 10 percent, medicaments and iron and steel at 55 and 45 percent respectively in February 2021 compared to February 2020. (*Refer to Table 7*).

Major source markets registered top four countries: Australia (25) percent, Singapore (17) percent, New Zealand (11) percent and China (10) percent, consequently accounting for 63 percent share to total imports value in February 2021. (*Refer to Table 8*). The main origin of imports by region recorded Oceania leading shares at 49 percent and also Asia representing 46 percent to total imports in February 2021. (*Refer to Table 9*).

Mode of Transport shares to total imports registered 76 percent by "Sea" and 11 percent by "Air" in February 2021. (*Refer to Table 10*)

End use categories of retained imports (BEC) comprised of consumption goods at 33 percent or (VT 969 million) capital goods at 24 percent or (VT 684 million) and intermediated goods at 22 percent or (VT 635 million) to total retained imports in February 2021. (*Refer to Table 14*)

Balance of trade	Balance of trade of goods is the net sum of exports and imports of goods.
	 Surplus denotes a positive trade balance which indicates that the value of exports has exceeded the value of imports. Deficit denotes negative trade balance which indicates that the value of imports has exceeded the value of exports.
BEC	Broad Economic Category: a classification that groups commodities according to its end use.
CIF	Cost, insurance and freight : includes the transaction value of the goods, insurance and freight to deliver the goods from the border of the exporting country to the border of the importing country.
FOB	Free on board : includes the transaction value of the goods and the value of services performed to deliver goods to the border of the exporting country.
HS	Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System: is a classification of exports and imports of goods. The latest version is '2017' and the custodian of it is the World Customs Organisation (WCO). Vanuatu uses the Vanuatu Harmonized System based off the WCOs HS17. Vanuatu HS is closely aligned to the Pacific HS2017. For HS Sections and Chapters refer to Appendix 3.
