





Population

1.1 Population of Tafea Province

The 2020 National population and housing census recorded 45,714 people were living in private households in Tafea province of which 50% were male and 50% female. Key feature of the Tafea population is that it has a young age structure with 44% of the population aged under 15 years and only 6% aged 60 years and over as shown by the population pyramid.

1.2 Population Density

Density is a good indicator of how population is distributed by area. A number higher than 12 persons per km² shows that the area is crowded.

Tafea province has a total land area of 1,627.779 km² and a total population of 45,714 according to the 2020 population and housing census. This means that the average population density for Tafea province was 28 people per km², an increase by two persons, from 23 people per km² in 2016.

1.3 Sex Ratio


Differences between the number of males and females can be measured using the sex ratio. In 2020, the sex ratio for Tafea province was 100:100, meaning that there are 100 males for every 100 females. It also means that there are equal number of males to females in Tafea.

Youth

2.1 Youth Population

The age group of 12-30 years is used in the National official youth policy and accounts for 14,922 of young people in Tafea Province. According to the 2020 Population projections 49.6% (7,403) were males compared to 50.4% (7,519) females. The youth population represents 32% of the total population of Tafea province.


Health

3.1 Deliveries (Births)

Total deliveries recorded the highest in 2018 from health centers/dispensaries representing 20.4% (1050 births) compare to a declining trend in 2019 and 2020.

In 2019 a decline of 15.2% (819) total births followed by 13.8% (708) in 2020.

Figure 3. 1: Total birth deliveries in Tafea, 2015 - 2020



3.2 Outpatient Consultations

Total outpatient consultations for all health facilities for Tafea Province in 2020 increased by 3% or 105,074 more consultations than the previous year. Tafea Community contributed greatly to this increase recording 95,826 consultations, an increase of 52,323 consultations. This indicates that more people visit the Lenakel Hospital more than community health centres.

Figure 3. 2: Tafea outpatient consultations by health facility, 2016 - 2020



3.3 Environmental diseases

Environmental health conditions in 2019 presented that 72 % (7,246) of people were infected with skin sepsis, which was the highest percentage of people, Infected than any other environmental diseases in Tafea Province, followed by Conjunctivitis at 13%. On the other hand, the Fish poisoning and eye infections made up less than 1% of the overall environmental health conditions.

Figure 3. 3: Total environmental health conditions in Tafea, 2019



Birth Registration

The highest Total birth registered was recorded in 2019 with 24,552 registered births which highlights a high increase in the number of birth registrations compare to the past 3 years. In the last 3 years no significant trend on birth registration has been identify. However, 2017 recorded a total of 9,260 while a decline 5,927 was recorded in 2018.

Figure 4. 1: Total birth registration in Tafea Province





Education

5.1 Total number of students in Tafea by School type

By education level, the Primary education stood very high throughout the five years (2015 to 2019) recording 10,745 which is the highest number of students in 2019 followed by secondary school students with 2,719 students, ECCE with 2,684 students. Primary students are increasing as shown in 2019 compare to all the previous years.

Figure 5. 1: Total number of students in Tafea by school type



5.2 Total Enrollments

Total enrolments stood at 16,148 in 2019. This shows an increase of 5% compared to 2018. 2016 recorded a slight decrease of 2% for student enrolments falling from 12,289 in 2015 to 12,012 enrolments.

Figure 5. 2: Total enrolment in Tafea, 2015 - 2019



5.3 Student Classroom Ratio for Primary Schools

In accordance to VEMIS digest annual reports, Student Classroom Ratio (SCR) is defined as average number of pupils per classroom, and in a school year the ideal size should be 30 students per classroom. The steady growth trend in SCR for Tafea province is above the standard ideal size at 39 students per classroom in 2020. This remained unchanged compared to 2019, however it was an increase of 2 more student compared to 2018 where there are 37 students per classroom.

Figure 5. 3: Pupil classroom ratio, Tafea Province, 2018 - 2020



5.4 Student Teacher Ratio

According to the MoET regulation order number 44 of 2005, the national Student-Teacher ratio by education level is 15 pupils to 1 teacher in ECCE, 1 teacher to 30 pupils in Primary, and 25-30 students per teacher in Secondary level. For the ECCE level, the student-teacher ratio dramatically increased from 11 in 2018 to 12 in 2020. Primary level shows a high increase of 1 teacher to 34 students in 2018 and 2019 whereas 2020 shows a slight increase in 1:35. Unlike ECCE and Primary, the student-teacher ratio for secondary level in 2018 stood at 1:32, and later increased to 1:33 in 2017 and 2018.

5.5 Number of teachers by level of Education

The number of teaching staff by sex indicates that from 2018 to 2020 the number of female teaching staffs is higher than the number of male teaching staffs. Secondary school level, males then to outnumbered females as there are more male teachers than female compare to other levels of education were females still dominating.



Justice

6.1 Crime Rates

In 2018, the total crimes committed in Tafea Province stood at 256. An increase of 67% over 2017. The lowest crime rate was recorded in 2017 at 153 depicting a huge decline of 61% from 395 in 2016. After the year 2016, crime rates decreased by 15% in 2017 and by 25% from 153 to 256 total crimes recorded in 2018.

6.2 Offense by type

The following table ranks the "top 10" type of crimes committed during 2015 to 2018. Intentional assault recorded the highest at 172 cases followed by threats to kill at 123 cases of Criminal trespass, followed by 106 cases recorded for both Damage to property and theft. The least committed crime was Rape which recorded at 8 cases.



6.3 Court cases by type

Of the four main island court cases, the common case is criminal which has the highest share from the four case types in 2015, 2016 and 2018 with 63% and 43% and 42% respectively. In 2017, Child Maintenance, Civil and Chiefly title all share an equal share of 30% while Debt constitutes of only 9%.

Figure 6. 2: Court cases by type from 2015 - 2019





Employment

7.1 VNPF Membership

A total of 25,745 members recorded from 2015 to 2020. The contributing members indicated that still male outnumbered female. Contributing members shown a continuous increase over the years with the highest in 2019 with a total of 5,622 members representing 3,526 male and 2,096 female. Moreover, within the period of 2015 to 2020, male represented 64% (16,527) with female 36% (9,218) of the total members contribution.

Figure 7. 1: VNPF contributing members/formal employment by sex, Tafea Province, 2015 - 2020





8.1 Total Revenue

The government revenue continues to indicate an increase in its annual revenue collection during 2015-2020 with over a total of 188 million vatu collected. However, the highest record was in 2019 representing 24% (45,831,357) of the total revenue.



Energy

9.1 Consumption rate

The consumption of electricity in Tafea has been increasing steadily as shown in the past four years. The total energy produced in 2020 stood at 758 kWh. This is a decrease of 46% when compared to 2019. The total value of energy generated in 2020 stood at VT 11 million. This decreased by 8% when compared to 2019. However, 2019 has the highest energy produced recorded in Tafea province compared to the other years.

Figure 9. 1: Tafea total energy consumption in kwh



9.2 Sources of electricity

Diesel is the major source of electricity in Tafea, accounting for 97% and solar usage accounts for 3% in 2020 of the total Tafea electricity usage. Diesel usage decreased by 45% over 2019. Energy produced from Solar also decreased by 52% over 2019 as well. Additional, 2020 indicated a decline in the energy production in Tafea province.

Figure 9. 2: Sources of electricity by usage (kwh) in Tafea





10.1 Coffee-Export

Tafea exported a total of 30 tonnes of coffee in the year 2018. This is an increase of 4 tons compared to 26 tons exported in 2017. The year 2015 recorded the lowest number of coffees tons exported at 8 tons which slowly increased by 7 tons to 15 tons in 2016.

Figure 10. 1: Total coffee export (in metric tons)



Figure 10. 2: Total fisherman license for Tafea



Figure 10. 3: Total fish production, 2016 - 2020





Figure 11. 1: Total new printed passports, 2016 - 2020



Figure 11. 2: Total driver's license by month for Tafea in 2020





Figure 12. 1: Total vehicle registration in Tafea, 2016 – 2019






13.2 Visitors to the three main islands

Figure 13. 2: Total visitor's average night spent, 2020





Figure 14. 1: Types of active cooperatives, 2020





14.2 Cooperative Membership, Dividend and Savings

Total membership, turnover and the share of dividend to members for Tafea Province has shown a decrease over the year 2017.

- Membership in 2020 stood at a total of 1,802, an increase of 2 members compared to 2019. The year 2015 recorded the lowest number of memberships at 486. This later slowly increased from 2016 onwards.
- The total dividend shared in 2020 stood at VT 2,395,167 million. This is an increase of VT 2,036,818 million compared to 2019. The lowest dividend shared was VT 127,007 thousand recorded for the year 2017.
- The total cooperative savings in 2020 stood at VT 5,256,974 million. This is a decline of 43% when compared to the previous year. The lowest savings recorded was in 2015 with a total of VT 217, 145 thousand.

Figure 14. 2: Total cooperatives turn over, dividend share in Tafea, 2015 - 2018





15.1 Vat Registration

A total of 24 registered business in Tafea province recorded an annual turnover of VT 4 million in 2020. This is a decrease of 14% over the previous year which recorded a total of 28 registered business. The highest number of registered businesses was recorded in 2016 with a total of 50. Provincial Data Challenges

There are several difficulties associated with the analysis of Provincial level Statistics. The coverage of statistical indicators varies within the geographical distribution. Being one of the main contributing factors, the collection and analysis of the statistical data had a great impact from the range of geographical hierarchy from the Area Council level to the Village level resulting in underutilization of statistical reporting. Thus, the snapshots of most of the socio-economic indicators of analyses were from particular areas within the provincial boundaries, used as a representation of the entire province statistical outlook.

Systems of collection and management of statistical information or data across entities is another contributing factor as most of the data providers do not have a proper system of collection and storage of data. Resources, both financial and human resource capacity contribute to the variation of the data collected.

Statistical literacy continues to be another challenge however with the setup of provincial statistical offices; one of the objectives is to promote statistical literacy and the importance on the use of statistics in all levels of decision and policymaking.
