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# STATISTICAL UPDATE: PORT VILA CENTRAL MARKET SURVEY

## **JUNE 2020**

The Port Vila Central Market Survey summarises selected agricultural products sold at the main local market based on the supply and price of commodities. Data is collected on a fortnightly basis and published as a quarterly average.


#### Summary of Findings:

The Port Vila Market Survey of June quarter of 2020 showed an overall volume index decrease of -91 percent on the supply of commodities while the average price index also decreased by -44 percent compared to the previous quarter.

- The supply of all agricultural produces decreased and contributed to the overall volume decrease compared to
  previous quarter except Lettuce and Chinese cabbage which increased in supply. The second announcement of
  covid-19 state of emergency for the next 30 days from April 11<sup>th</sup> and the continuous renovation of the central
  market limited the number of vendors at the market and contributed to the decline of overall volume.
- The value of commodities decreased by -90 percent at VT113,060.
- An average of 29 sellers was recorded for the quarter under review. This is a decline of -90 percent from the previous quarter and also a decrease of -93 percent compared to June 2019.

## **OVERVIEW**

The Port Vila Market Survey in June quarter 2020 showed an overall volume index decrease of -91 percent from the previous quarter. Most of the agricultural produces recorded a declined with the exception of Lettuce and Chinese cabbage. When compared to the corresponding quarter of previous year, the overall volume supplied also decreased by -95 percent. (Refer to table 4).




The overall average price per kilograms decreased by -44 percent compared to the previous quarter. Lower prices were recorded for all commodities except Dried coconut, Manioc, Tomato and Fiji taro which increased. Compared

to June quarter of 2019, the current overall price level decreased by -32 percent. (Refer to table 5).


## FIJI TARO

The supply of Fiji Taro decreased by -70 percent from the previous quarter which pushes average price per kilogram up by 36 percent. Compared to June 2019, the supply of Fiji Taro decreased significantly by -95 percent and average price also decreased by -20 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




### **ISLAND TARO**

June quarter of 2020 recorded no supply of Island Taro at the Port Vila Central Market. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




#### MANIOC

The current supply of Manioc in the quarter under review decreased by -76 percent compared to March quarter of 2020, while the average price increased by VT81 per kilograms. When compared with June quarter of 2019, quantity supplied for Manioc also decreased by -90 percent while average price increased by VT62. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




## KUMALA (SWEET POTATO)

Kumala or Sweet Potato recorded a fall in average volume supplied by -97 percent compared to the previous quarter and average price also decreased by -7 percent. Compared with same quarter of previous year, the volume of Kumala decreased by -97 percent while the average price decreased by -27 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




## <u>YAM</u>

There are no Yams supplied to Port Vila Central Market in June quarter of 2020. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




### **GREEN BANANA**

June 2020 recorded an average supply of 51 Kilograms of Green Banana. This is a decrease of -96 percent compared with the previous quarter and also the average price declined by -13 percent. Compared with corresponding quarter of previous year, the quantity of Green Banana supplied to Port Vila Market decreased by -97 percent and the average price also decreased by -10 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




### DRIED COCONUTS


At an average of 87 Kilograms, Dried Coconut supply decreased by -93 percent compared to the previous quarter while average price increased by VT114. Current availability was -96 percent lower compared to June quarter of 2019 while average price increased by VT121 per kilogram. (Refer to table 1 & 2).





## **FRUITS**

An overview of Fruits supplied to Port Vila Central Market in the second quarter of 2019 showed a decrease of Ripe banana at -99 percent and Pawpaw at -99 percent compared to the previous quarter while no data was recorded for Watermelon and Green coconut. When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the supply of all fruits studied decreased significantly. (Refer to table 1).









Ripe banana and Pawpaw recorded a decrease in average price of -84 percent and -74 percent respectively compared to previous quarter. Compared to same quarter of previous year, the average price of Ripe Banana also decreased by -73 percent and Pawpaw by -66 percent. (Refer to table 2).


#### **VEGETABLE**


A summary of vegetables in the quarter under review recorded a decline in most Vegetable supplies except Lettuce and Chinese cabbage which increased by 20 kilograms and 141 kilograms respectively compared to the previous quarter. Vegetable supplies that decreased were Cucumber at -198 kilograms, Island cabbage at - 187 kilograms, Pumpkin at -101 kilograms, Tomato at - 75 kilograms, White bowl cabbage at -33 kilograms, Carrot at -6 kilograms and Purple bowl cabbage at -2 kilograms.


Compared to June 2019, all vegetables recorded significant decrease in volume supplied to the market except Purple bowl cabbage which remained unchanged. (Refer to table 1).


The average price per kilograms in June 2020 recorded an increase for Tomato by an average price of VT321 compared to previous quarter. However, the rest of the commodities recorded a fall in average price which includes Chinese cabbage at VT360, Carrot at VT297, Pumpkin at VT152, Lettuce at VT 130, Cucumber VT95, White bowl cabbage at VT43, Purple bowl cabbage and Island cabbage at VT35 and VT20 each.


Compared to the same quarter of 2019, average price per kilograms increased for Cucumber and Island Cabbage at 73 percent and 38 percent respectively. Vegetables that decreased includes Carrot and Pumpkin at -100 percent each, Chinese cabbage at -42 percent, Lettuce at -20 percent, Tomato at -12 percent, White bowl cabbage at -3 while Purple bowl cabbage remained unchanged. (Refer to table 2).
























#### SELLERS PER PRODUCE


June quarter of 2019 recorded a total of 29 sellers<sup>1</sup> at the Port Vila Central Market. This is a decrease of -90 percent from the previous quarter and also a decrease of -93 percent in the corresponding quarter of previous year. (Refer to table 6).

Chinese cabbage contributed the largest share of sellers at 21 percent which is an increase by 3 vendors compared to previous quarter and fell by 19 sellers compared to same quarter of previous year. Island cabbage is the second largest contributors recorded a 16 percent share which is a decrease of 26 sellers and 28 sellers compared to March 2020 and June 2019 correspondingly. Cucumber contributed to 12 percent share which is a decline of 9 percent in the previous quarter and 20 percent in the same quarter of 2019. Green banana contributed to 11 percent share which decreased by -43 percent each in previous quarter and June quarter of last year. Manioc and Dried coconut contributed to 7 percent share each of sellers which is a decrease for both commodities compared to previous quarter at -6 percent and -17 percent respectively. Compared to same quarter of 2019, both produces also recorded a decrease of -14 percent and -33 percent each. Lettuce contributed to 6 percent share of sellers and increased by 2 percent in March 2020 but fell by -7 percent in the same quarter of previous year. The rest of the commodities contributed to less than 5 percent share of sellers in June quarter of 2020.





### VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of commodities at the Port Vila Market in the referenced quarter is VT113,060 which is a fall of -90 percent over March quarter of 2020 and -94 percent compared to same quarter of year 2019. (Refer to table 3).



#### **CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS**

The Port Vila Market Survey was instigated to measure the price and volume of specific agricultural produces in the main market. The survey is conducted on a fortnightly basis.

Data analysed in this report shows quarterly average supply and prices of the commodities under study. Weights are based on 2016 using HIES 2010 and Agriculture Census 2007 and were used henceforth.

## NEXT UPDATE (QUARTERLY) RELEASE DATE

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35% Cucumber constituted the largest share in value at 29 percent. This is a fall of -72 percent compared to March 2020 and -55 percent compared to June 2019. Chinese cabbage has the second largest share of value at 19 percent followed by Dried coconut at 12 percent. Chinese cabbage increased by 25 percent compared to previous quarter and fell by -81 percent compared to same quarter of last year. Dried coconut on the other hand, decreased both compared to previous guarter and same quarter of 2019 by -78 percent and -86 percent respectively. Island cabbage and Manioc contributed to 9 percent and 8 percent each. Both of which decreased compared to previous guarter at -75 percent and -21 percent each and compared to same quarter of last year at -67 percent and -78 percent respectively. Lettuce and White bowl cabbage constituted 7 percent and 6 percent share each of the value of commodities. Lettuce increased by VT6 in value compared to March 2020 but decreased by VT7 in value compared to June 2019. Meanwhile, White bowl cabbage fell compared to previous guarter and same guarter of last year by -62 percent and -88 percent respectively. The rest of the

commodities contributed to less than 5 percent share of

value.
